Manager/Staff Update – LC, DV, DH, CB	 LC updated the Board to say that we have been successful in our bid to the UK Shared Prosperity Fund via BMBC which will enable us to distribute 500 hygiene packs across the borough. Our application to the Affordable Warmth Charter has been successful and we are now allowed to use the Charter mark for the next 12 months. BMBC are now launching a Carers and Young Carers Charter Mark and LC will send detail around the Board Members. A copy of the Terms of Reference for the Barnsley Place Partnership have been requested and will be shared with Board members once received. DH updated the Board with work she has been involved with regarding our 10th Birthday celebrations and the Hygiene Poverty project. DV gave an update on work being done with Trans Barnsley, Barnsley Mental Health Forum and the Overview and Scrutiny Committee sub group on sexual reproduction. CB gave an update on the events planned in her areas including winter warmer events
6. NHS South Yorkshire	 and more money in your pocket events. The ICP Strategy has now been released in draft form and we fed back on the strategy and the engagement by the deadline of 6th January. We noted that the engagement was poor but acknowledged that timescales were tight. Barnsley was well represented with Healthwatch Barnsley assisting over 75 residents to complete the survey and attending 11 of the 22
