	This was an exchange of information, SW gave feedback from the surveys Healthwatch had conducted

	<ol> <li>Equality and Engagement committee Gave presentation on survey findings, SW and Magpie were invited to do presentations on their respective surveys.</li> <li>South Yorkshire and Bassetlaw Leads meeting - Requested Adrian attend next meeting to update on SY&amp;B ICS. Doncaster and Sheffield Healthwatch have moved over to using the Healthwatch England website, SW recommended looking at doing this later in the year.</li> <li>Weekly team meetings</li> </ol>
Margaret Lindquist	<ol> <li>Tested two new safeguarding training modules and fed back to SW who provided feedback to the trainer.</li> <li>Living with and beyond cancer The recruitment of a specialist cancer nurse is for the hospital to help break down barriers to change in the system relaying to the work of the LWABC programme.</li> <li>An Advanced Nurse Practitioner has been in place in the residential homes in Barnsley for 2 years working to ensure Care Plans are in place for residents dealing particularly with end of life so that the care is what the resident ad their family want. There is a review ongoing into that work.</li> <li>The CCG and Cancer Alliance are working together on the personalisation of care for cancer patients.</li> <li>Urgent and Emergency Care Meeting, NHS Transformation of Urgent and Emergency Care document was discussed. One of the ideas in the document was to pass patients that did not need lifesaving interventions from the Emergency Department to the Urgent Treatment Centre but Barnsley does not have one - the only one in South Yorkshire is in Doncaster. They are looking at the possibility of a virtual system to organise where patients need to be, working on the existing cooperation between Right Care Barnsley and other parts of the system.</li> <li>There is significant building work at the BDGH site, which will result in a Paediatric Emergency Department opening at the end of March and an Ambulatory Care Unit and Surgical Assessment Unit by the end of June. It is hoped that this should cover the need for an urgent treatment centre and still allow separate paths for COVID and Non- COVID patients in the emergency department. They are</li> </ol>
	working to improve referrals from 111 to Right Care Barnsley (RCB) to make sure patients are sent to the correct destination when they are all open. Yorkshire ambulance Service reported there has been a

	10% increase in calls mainly due to COVID in the last 12 months.
	Overall, emergency department demand was reduced by first Lockdown then spiked in September before reducing again.
	There was an increased access to Community Referrals for a 2 hour response and they are investigating what services may be available at home with the relevant agencies to facilitate holistic assessment without having to go to the Emergency department.
	Work is ongoing providing Single Point of Access to services. All agencies working closely together to improve the system. Readmissions Audit report was included in the meeting
	and can be forwarded by SW to board members if requested. SWYPFT and RCB will be working together to facilitate reducing unnecessary admissions along with plans to improve awareness of community provisions that could be put in place quickly to avoid overnight admissions of frail but not acutely ill patients who could be better cared for at home.
Mark smith	<ol> <li>Good Governance (ICS and system transformation) Webinar Katherine Bell from ICS gave interesting input with a walk through of work done in Croydon</li> <li>Mental Health Crisis Care Concordat and suicide prevention have been disbanded with the Mental Health Delivery Group now in place. The first delivery group meeting has taken place and partners gave information.</li> <li>Legislative changes in mental health act MS ran through the proposed changes to the act and AE asked that once changes had been agreed MS report to the board on this.</li> </ol>
Adrian England	<ol> <li>Covid monitoring Barnsley is currently worst in country for infection rates. There does not seem to be a specific reason for this Vaccinations are going very well.</li> <li>Integrated Care Delivery Group Weekly meetings, main issues were mental health, workers, particularly healthcare workers and teachers, the hospital and swyft are concerned, they are continuing to work on the risks on all health and social care systems, communication systems are still an issue with using digital systems.</li> <li>Integrated care system</li> </ol>

	White paper consulted on. AE had lengthy meeting over COMPACT agreement. Steering group has another meeting in April to move forward.

Online assessment will tell you what was wrong if answer is incorrect.</li> <li>The adult safeguarding plan is now in draft but is not yet ready to share.</li> </ol>
8. Managers' Report	<ol> <li>Survey results from Jan were summarised - 149 responses received, and some of those had been supported over the phone to complete the survey. Survey information will be reported in the next meeting as part of the overall 12- month intelligence report. MS asked are there distribution lists the board could view. SW to circulate. ML asked for Barnsley Healthcare Federation to be included in distribution moving forwards.</li> <li>Vaccine Programme survey- SW spoke to Kirsty Waknell about whether it is was worth adapting the HWE survey template. They wanted to look at general intelligence and then get back to SW, awaiting response.</li> <li>Recruitment for Engagement and Volunteer Coordinator - 10 applications were received, shortlisting will take place Friday 12<sup>th</sup> March, with interviews at the end of March</li> <li>Healthwatch England annual report Sent out for information or questions, waiting for template for local annual report, aiming to complete this by the end of May as first draft.</li> </ol>
