Barnsley Hospital - ML	<ol> <li>December and January meetings were stood down due to pressures on the system with the latest Covid surge</li> <li>Same Day Emergency Care (SDEC) is functioning really well, wanting more referrals via GP's who were still directing to A&amp;E.</li> <li>Huge pressures on Emergency Care and Ambulances</li> <li>Social Care facing problems with care packages being handed back by providers who are unable to fulfil contracts, this is a problem nationally.</li> <li>I Heart are reporting pressures on the out of hours service. Demand is erratic and unpredictable, staff are tired and unwilling to do extra hours.</li> </ol>

Looking at updating the telephony in surgeries to a cloud based system.</li> <li>CQC have a new monitoring approach, no major problems reported.</li> <li>Extended Access and Out of hours contract, single tender waiver applied.</li> <li>Problems continue within Primary Care with the high demand and lack of appointments.</li> </ol>
